My grandfather, an Irish champion fly caster and fly tyer, started teaching me how to tie flies at the age of five. I bought my first HMH Vise in 1975 and have never turned back. The one standard I tie on now has hundreds of thousands of flies turned out on it. When not fishing or guiding, I tie between 4 & 9 hours per day. I have a second HMH Standard that is dedicated for rotary tying - mostly for silk and tinsel wraps.
